AIR TRAVEL

Three airports service the Washington area. The Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA) is 7 miles from DO and handles all major national airlines. The Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD) services all national and international airlines and is 26 miles west of Washington. The Baltimore Washington International Airport (BWI) services all major national and international airlines from its position 30 miles north-east of the city.

PARKING

No parking is available for symposium participants at Dumbarton Oaks. There is unlimited street parking on Sunday, but the District of Columbia is efficient about ticketing over the 2-hour limit in this zone on weekdays and Saturdays.

Available public parking close to Dumbarton Oaks approximately 12 minutes walk to the campus.

LIBRARY ACCESS

We encourage you to take the opportunity to get a valid Dumbarton Oaks Reader's badge while you are here. Valid badges will not be necessary to attend the symposium but are necessary if you wish to use the Library at any point during your visit. It will also allow you more freedom of movement around the property on the days before and after the symposium, and you can retain the badge for any future visits to Dumbarton Oaks.

Security and Library staff will be available to make new or replacement badges for symposium participants and to give an orientation to the new Library. The production of the badges usually only takes a few minutes; the orientation of the Library will last approximately 45 minutes to an hour, and it is required of all new visitors to the Library. No badges will be created during the days of the symposium, but we are happy to schedule appointments for you on Monday, May 4 if you prefer to wait until after the symposium to get your badge and your orientation. Staff members will need to have a list of people to expect at the specified times, so we ask that you
