Lindley's Monographe Rosarum (1820)

ATTAR OF ROSE - an oil manufactured in Southeastern Europe and Asia from
R. Damascena and *R. alba* - now produced in Germany

Fruits of some varieties of roses made into preserves in France and England—
probably *R. villosa* and *R. canina*

The Musk Rose (*R. moschata*) native of the Himalayas and known since the 16th
century has almost disappeared - several hybrids have been produced.

John Champney produced the Noisette roses by crossing the Musk Rose with
the blush China rose.

LIRIODENDRON (TULIPIFERA) TULIP TREE from the Greek Lily Tree -belongs to Magnolia family - white wood used on drawer fronts and overlays of expensive furniture. Tree grows to 150 ft or more

QUERCUS alba and Quercus rubra only oaks used for furniture. Oaks have innumerable used as timbers shipbuilding. Abraham Lincoln's birthplace built of oak logs still stands

CHERRY WOOD (*Prunus serotina*) is a commercial wood produced largely in the states of Virginia, Tennessee, Maryland and Pennsylvania. Used for furniture, interior trim and tool handles. Color deepens with age.

ASH (*Fraxinus Americana*) resists decay, wood used for washboards -drain-boards, baseball bats, agricultural tools and airplane parts.

SOPHORA Japonica (Chinese scholar tree)sometimes called Japanese pagoda tree introduced from China and Korea in early 18th century -late flowering ornamental remaining green until late in Autumn, green pods like beans.

Koelreuteria paniculata (Varnish tree) -introduced from Korea, China and Japan early 18th century. deciduous -conspicuous panicles of yellow flowers in early summer. (Ornamental)

CASTANEA dentata (American chestnut) Were it not for the devastating chestnut blight this tree would be among the more important commercial and horticultural trees of the Eastern states. Sweet edible nuts in burs appear in October (if the squirrels don't get there first) The bark is an important source of tannin for the leather industry. Wood is used for fence posts and railway ties

JUGLANS nigra (black walnut) Common in the Eastern half of the U.S. Wood has been used since earliest times for fine furniture and for many purposes is stronger than white oak. Used for gun stocks and airplane

airplane propellers It is durable in contact with soil. Nuts are in demand by confectioners and bakers Black walnuts among the rapid growing hardwoods.

CARYA (*Hicoria*) ovata Hickory nut - a distinctly American tree -often reaches 140 ft. Common in woodlots and pastures from Maine to Texas. No other hardwood as tough as hickory, but it is not durable in soil. Wood is used for hatchet handles, picks, hammers, spokes and rims of wheels and wagon shafts. The nuts are sweet and ripen in October.

CORYLUS avellana (European hazel) Deciduous shrub or small tree long cultivated in Europe for the edible nuts and for ornament. Flowers appear before leaves in Spring and nuts ripen in Autumn (perhaps)
