Grape Arbor bordering the lower east kitchen garden.

Clematis in variety on the west side including Jackmanni, Duchess of Edinburgh, Henryii, Vita alba, flamula (?) and small varieties of Clematis ?? (give for varieties). On other parts of the arbor occasional Concord and Niagara grapes should be grown although these are mainly devoured by the birds and therefore in time may be wise to eliminate entirely. Spring bulbs such as Narcissus and Scilla may edge the path under the arbor.

The arbor is constructed of run concrete octagonal posts in a plate of 100057 chestnut (?) and rafters of round natural wood laid on the plate. An elaborate construction would not be appropriate in this place nor would a big roof be attractive not as the view from the upper terrace should/be too much interrupted by the line of an arbor which would be the case if there were an elaborate construction with big roof and intircate tattice.
